

Everything is progressing very nicely for our joint club gathering on the weekend of September 21-24. MOGNW members Bill Button, Gil Stegen and Craig Runions made another reconnaissance run from Seattle to Crater Lake and back on April 17-18 (just over 1,000 miles).

Over 30 Morgans are registered so far and the Running Y Ranch Resort is ready to take care of us. Our goal is 40. Accommodations are still available under the **group name 'MOGNW'**; however, please note other details below. The Crater Lake Run will be a resounding success in any event.

The general plan is to meet Friday evening after arrival for a "Beer & Bangers" social, do a tour-drive on Saturday to Crater Lake for a picnic lunch and have a banquet Saturday night. Sunday could include a drive to Jacksonville (historic town outside Medford), a drive to Shakespearian theme town Ashland, or just lay back and schmooze or avail yourself of the 18-hole Arnold Palmer Golf Course and the many other on-site amenities. You might choose to have Sunday dinner at Schatzie's, the local on-site restaurant. Bill, Gil and Craig ate there and it is very nice.

MOGNW is working on a route from Seattle to Crater Lake starting on Thursday with an overnight at the Vagabond Lodge in Hood River, then down the east side of Mt. Hood to Bend and on to Klamath Falls. Bob Koupal of the Northern California Morgan Club has worked on their 2-day route north from the Bay area on Hwy 1 to include an overnight in Eureka.

Book your room reservations now at the Running Y (1-888-850-0275) if you are at all interested in this trip. The last rooms are filling up. The Running Y has a reasonable cancellation policy and they are heavily booked with functions immediately prior to and following ours. Fortunately, we blocked out sufficient accommodations last November! **Please let Bill Button know if you have any problems making a reservation!**

Event costs are being finalized. While not firm, they are on target as outlined in previous flyers. At a minimum, the Friday night social, Saturday night banquet and other incidental administrative **costs must be prepaid by check to MOGNW by August 15th**. MOGNW will mail a remittance voucher outlining all costs and the dinner and box lunch menu choices by July 15th to all confirmed participants. Watch for it in your mail.

Financial report. We have about 6900\$ and are on track. Discussion that we should have 5000\$ working cash and that this be reviewed nearer the end of the year. Financial report approved.

Southern Report. Devils Punch bowl in June. Southern meetings were taking a turn for the better. They are meeting at Portland Brewing once a month. Wine tour planed for September and 4 cars are planning to attend VanDusen. Portland ABFM party is being planned.

Midlands Report. Format is changing to include more driving events. Difficult to find out what members want. ABFM being worked on. Hood Canal tour planned for August 11th and Caboose run June 2nd-3rd.

Northern report. Classic Car show at Abbotsford. May 19 VanDusen ABFM after party to be at Miles and plans are underway. A run is planned after VanDusen. Bylaws. The old bylaws have been reviewed by the Ex-Presidents Ad Hoc Committee and revised to fit what is now practiced by the club. Copies were circulated. The final draft will be discussed at the next meeting with suggested additions as to job descriptions. The officers thanked the past presidents who had worked on these proposals.

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
Friends

There is a Mog in the shop now and wouldn't you know it's got a Lucas driving lamp in a box without the tailor-made bracket and the owner wants it installed. So I sat there in front of the car, studied the situation and gradually a simple solution came to me. And it is easy for a Professional Morgan Owner to make in the average bear garage in an afternoon away from Pro Football.

All the metal is one eighth inch steel flat bar available from most neighborhood hardware stores, 1/8" x 1" and 1/8" x 2". A few 1/4" fasteners and a drill motor is all that's required to begin your bracket apprenticeship.

Let me explain that Unit "B", which the driving lamp actually bolts to, can be rotated on Unit "A" to wherever it's convenient, by altering the drilled holes for the fasteners. The position of Unit "B" on the drawing is what worked for this car. I'm sure the dimensions may be altered to suit a particular application while the basic design parameters stay the same. Unit "A" can be bent further upward or downward, and it can be attached to the inner bumper bracket at whatever position you'd like it to assume.

The dimensions are given in the drawing. Take your time and enjoy yourself and imagine you're making the sixty bucks an hour the garage gorilla guerrillas aren't charging you.
